
Leading Children to Christ

It is *vital* that the decision a child makes is 6______ decision. We don't want to give children a 7_____ assurance of their Salvation; which may hinder them from *true* conversion at a later time.

It would be better to <u>wait</u> on making a decision, than to pray a prayer that is not really genuine.



The Weeding-out Process

Children who come forward *for Salvation* are sent to the counseling room with one of the counselors.


Children who come forward to pray for things <u>other</u> than *Salvation*, can be divided into two separate groups:

- 1. The Prayer Group, and
- 2. The *Reassurance Group*.


If they say, "No," and insist that they have *never done anything* wrong — then they are either too 19______ to understand or they are *lying*. Either way, they are *not ready* to get saved. Pray with them and ask God to show them that they are *indeed* a sinner and in *need* of Jesus as their Savior.

If a child cannot be talked into being a ²⁰_____, then neither should they be talked into becoming a Christian.

It is very important that the child realizes their *sinful condition* and their *need* for a Savior. If they cannot understand *(or admit)* this, then they should *not* be led any further – this could lead to a 21______ decision, and many problems later for *genuine* conversion.



Keep in mind that many children need 22 to words such as: Sin, Wages, Perish, Everlasting, and Death. (Example: Rom. 6:23 - Death means: being separated from God forever – in a terrible place called "Hell").
