Penny Offering Team Captains

Thank you so much for your faithful service to our Lord! Your part in the meetings this week is <u>very</u> important!

- Please try to be at the penny table no later than **30 minutes before** each service begins.
- Have a positive spirit and be excited about leading your team, but keep in mind the purpose of the offering and be a <u>good sport</u>. No matter who wins or loses, your <u>testimony</u> is more important than the outcome of the Penny Offering.
- Encourage people to keep the wrapper **on** the rolls of pennies (not only does it **weigh** more, but it also keeps **you** from having to **re-roll the pennies**).
- Encourage those who are **not buying pennies** to have a seat in the auditorium (*this keeps the penny table area from becoming a "bottle neck"*).



 We will have 10 gold bricks ready for the penny team to use. These bricks can be sold for \$5.00 each and placed into the penny buckets. This adds excitement for everyone involved. The Penny Offering is for all who attend (young people, as well as adults). Anyone can purchase a brick for either side.

Please note the following tips when working with the bricks:

- Use only provided gold bricks (no outside bricks please).
- The ladies can buy up to 5 bricks and the guys can buy up to 5 bricks the guys cannot come early and buy all 10 bricks.



• If <u>all 10</u> of the bricks have been sold <u>and</u> someone else wants to buy a brick, then <u>all 10</u> bricks should be taken out of the buckets and resold. Be sure to keep a tally of how many times <u>all 10</u> bricks have been taken out of the buckets (this amount will be added to the totals each evening). If the ladies have all 5 of their bricks sold and the guys only have 2 of their bricks sold, the ladies cannot buy the quys'

remaining bricks (for the **ladies**' bucket) - they need to buy pennies instead (each team can never have more than 5 bricks in their bucket at a time). This process can continue until the **conclusion** of the count down during the weighing of the pennies. Keep the last round of bricks **in** the bucket, when you bring the buckets to the front.

- It is important to remember that **pennies** are what make the difference in the long run. The bricks can come and go, but the pennies (*for the most part*) are there to stay. The winner is **usually** the team with the most pennies in their bucket.
- The penny buckets start out empty each evening, rather than accumulating over the week.
- If you happen to run out of pennies to sell, remove the <u>exact</u> <u>same</u> amount of penny rolls from each bucket and then resell them; rather than taking that number of pennies out of the **opposing** teams' bucket. Although it is technically





- correct, it can be <u>very</u> confusing.
- All money (paper and coin) used to <u>buy</u> bricks or rolls of pennies needs to be placed into the cash box (we will have one with us that you are welcome to use). Please do not "double-up" by also putting the money used to <u>buy</u> pennies and bricks into the buckets.
