One of these young ladies was Mrs. Betty's granddaughter (Mrs. Betty was the ladies' team captain). The angels in Heaven weren't the only ones rejoicing over these decisions!





The food drive for *Compassion Cupboard* (a local food pantry) went very well, with 13,833 pounds of canned goods brought in. This is the second year *Liberty* has done a food drive in place of the penny offering at our meetings. There's something special about being a part of

something that impacts the lives of so many people.



On our way home (on June 22nd) from *Liberty Baptist Church*, we stopped for fuel at the Pilot in Wytheville, VA. As sometimes happens, a man approached Tim while he was pumping fuel (*he had been sitting against the wall of the store for quite a while*). Usually, people ask Tim for money after telling him their story, but this time the man didn't ask for money – he asked for a ride to Bristol, VA. We never pick-up hitch-hikers, but this

time we felt the Lord wanted us to help him. I (Susan) was lying down in the back seat (*because of some pain issues*), so the front seat was open.

While traveling to Bristol, he spent a lot of the time telling us his story. We shared the Gospel with him, and he was very down-cast, realizing that he did not deserve to go to Heaven. We agreed with him that we're **all** undeserving. Then he shared that he had been in prison for 18 years, and was having a difficult time acclimating back into society (*he had been out for 3 years*). After sharing more Scripture with him, Tim asked if there was anything that would stop him from making the decision to ask Jesus to save him. With tears in his eyes, he said, "No, there isn't." He bowed his head and cried as he prayed to ask Jesus to forgive his sin and to allow him a place in Heaven. *It was obvious that this meeting was planned by God to bring one more soul to Him!* We helped him to get in contact with a pastor in Bristol, a former *Rock of Ages Prison Ministry* missionary. Please pray for Arthur. God can really use him to reach others who need the same kind of help.

We just finished a great week at **Camp Fairview**, July 8th-12th. Our next e-mail will share the update from this week.

Please pray for Tim and his family in the passing of his brother, Steve (on July 6th). Steve had leukemia for the past few years, and developed congestive heart failure, and kidney and liver failure. We were planning to make the trip (on Monday and Tuesday) to Lincoln, NE for Steve's funeral on Wednesday, but we are sick with a really bad stomach bug we picked-up from Camp this week. We will miss being there with our family.

Please be praying for our next meeting at *Maranatha Baptist Church*, in Rantoul, IL (July 21st-25th). We hope to be feeling better by then.
