Dear Praying Friends,

The below text was sent to a few friends, asking for prayer for the trip to our next meeting, in IL. However, the events leading up to this trip became so ridiculous, that we knew we needed to share them with you. (pictures have been added)

At the very end, we will share several responses to this text. We hope you will be encouraged in your faith, as well as challenged to join our **Prayer Warriors** who pray so faithfully for us and this ministry.

This text started out as a prayer request for our journey, through the night, to our next meeting in Rantoul, IL (near Chicago). But it has ended up being an accounting of today's happenings, because of how late we finished the text. At least now you can see why we asked you to pray.

A lot has happened today. And we KNOW that God is going to do a work in Rantoul, IL this week! Especially when we see how hard Satan is fighting.

The stomach virus, that we caught at Camp last week, has held-on to all 3 of us. But we are on the upside finally. We still do not feel well, but we are much better than we were. Praise the Lord!

We had planned to leave early this morning (Friday), but there was a problem with Rachel's car. As we were getting ready to pull out, Rachel's car would not start. We've been home sick for a week, so we just thought the battery had somehow lost its charge.

We had to put the main slide-out on the 5th Wheel to be able to get the other key fob, but the 2 batteries on the 5th Wheel were completely dead, so we could not put the slide out.

We hooked-up Rachel's car to a charger, disconnected the truck from the 5th Wheel, and then drove to Walmart to replace the 2 batteries on the 5th Wheel.

On the way, we took Rachel to the home she is staying at, so she could put her groceries away. She had planned to get a friend to take her to get her car later.

After getting back home with the new batteries, and getting the key fob, we found that Rachel's car STILL would not start. The charger was reading that the battery was bad. So, this is now 3 batteries that have to be replaced.

Instead of a "Bad Hair Day", we were having a "Bad Battery Day."

Before leaving for town again to get the 3rd battery, Tim's 60-piece socket set fell open and dumped onto the gravel. AS that was happening, Tim saw a wasp crawling up the driver's seat. For some reason, he guickly grabbed it and threw it

out of the car, but not before being stung on the top of his hand. So, not only is he completely drenched because of the heat, but his socket set is lying on the gravel, and his hand is now burning, red, and swollen.

Our first thought was that we needed to get the Benadryl, and I would need to drive we much of the 11-hour trip. Well, that's a big problem, because I can barely keep my eyes open, due to the fatigue I am constantly dealing with. Thankfully, Tim waited to take the Benadryl.

The most frustrating part about this though, is that on a Dodge Journey, you can't just pop the hood open to check the battery or to remove it. You can't even SEE the battery from the top of the engine. You have to take the left, front tire off in order to get to it; along with removing the mud flap, that is in front of the front tire, which totally conceals the battery.



Tim finally got the battery disconnected, and we headed to Advanced Auto.

After getting back home, Tim had to pull the cables down past where the mud flap was, so he could make sure the clamps were tight.

As he looked at the clamps, he saw that one of them

was broken and could NOT be tightened. So back to Advanced Auto we went. Only, Advanced Auto did not have that particular clamp; but thankfully, O'Reilly's did.



On our way back home, we decided to swing by and get Rachel, so she could have her car.



Tim successfully replaced the battery, along with the clamp, mud flap, AND tire. Praise the Lord, Rachel's car started right up!

After picking-up our *first* meal of the day (to go), we began our 11-hour trip to Rantoul, IL, at 8:00 PM.

We were able to drive through the night, and made it to Rantoul at 6:40 AM (EST). I ordered a Mocha Frappe (at 2:00 AM) from McDonald's, (since Dunkin' Donuts was not open), and it gave me enough alertness to drive for 2 hours while Tim slept. Praise the Lord for allowing us to spell each other!

We thank the Lord for His safety and protection on this trip! There were no accidents or incidents. I personally prayed Psalm 34:7 for this entire journey!

As we pulled in to hook-up our 5th Wheel, there was a big, **beautiful**, orange sunrise just over the horizon. It was as if the Lord was saying, "**Welcome to Rantoul!**" (If I had thought quickly enough, I could have gotten a picture. I even went online to see if there were any sunrises CLOSE to what we saw, but no picture I saw online even came close to the blood orange sunrise we saw.)

When things go wrong that slow us down, we know that God has a plan. Either He is keeping us from a terrible accident down the road, or there is someone He wants us to witness to at this particular time of day.
