We are currently at **Church Street Baptist Church**, in Greensboro, NC. They are hosting the **Piedmont Jubilee** Monday-Friday (August 5-9). We will be ministering with the young people each evening for their **Kid's Jubilee** – pray that God will work in hearts and many decisions will be made for Him.

This past week, we were at **Riverside Baptist Church**, in



Clarington, OH. It was a great week of ministry! As Tim gave the invitation on Sunday evening, 11-year-old Donovan

draw Donovan to Himself, and that he finally came and asked the Lord to save him. His sister, Jayda, accepted the Lord during our meeting in 2022.

As many of you know, the last few years have been very difficult for Susan due to her health – and we believe that mold issues in our 5th Wheel are contributing to her health problems.

What's amazing is that God is *literally* building us our first home! We broke ground in February of 2023, and were able to get our house "in the dry" before taking off for our meetings last summer.

When we got home, we were able to rough-in the plumbing and electric, insulate the walls, hang and paint the sheet rock, install the cabinets, and lay the flooring before taking off for our meetings *this* summer.

With summer coming to a close, and with Susan's health like it is, we feel an *urgency* to *finish* the house. A lot of people have asked, "What needs to be done to the house so you can move in?"

Our contractor has been working on some numbers, and several of our supporting pastors have encouraged us to share this need.



The **1**st **step** when we get home will be to complete the **Electrical** and get the **HVAC** installed.

Two Churches have expressed an interest in helping with this step, and several individuals plan to help me wire-in the breakers, plugs, switches, lights, and smoke detectors.
