As we have continued to pray concerning the funds to complete our home, a friend from Church felt led to offer us a \$20,000.00, interest-free loan to help us get moved-in before Christmas. We were speechless at such a generous offer. Up to this point, we have not considered taking out a loan. We sought much counsel and prayed over this decision for several days, and felt that God was



leading us to accept their offer. As we looked at Susan's declining health, it was very clear that she needed to get out of the 5th Wheel so she could begin ridding her body of the black mold that is making her so sick. It was also clear that our home needed to be at a consistent temperature to keep the walls and ceilings from cracking. Several areas already had to be repaired and we surely do not want any further problems. Please pray that God will provide for us to pay back this loan as soon as possible (we accepted \$17,000.00 of the loan to pay for the HVAC and crawlspace encapsulation). Susan's sisters decided to give us their parents' dining room hutch. This is very special to Susan's family, and she was definitely surprised. We so appreciate their kindness to us! It has been amazing to watch God miraculously provide for every room in our home.





Our last update on November 7th, shared about the things that had recently been done on our home:



countertops, sinks, faucets, tiling in the main bathroom and kitchen backsplash, kitchen appliances (for 70% off), doors, and baseboards. What a **blessing** to get these installed! It's been amazing to watch our house turn into a home.

In the last few weeks, the HVAC and ductwork have been installed, the plumbing finished, and we passed the final



electrical inspection. Also, a missionary family gave the funds to pay for the fans and bathroom mirrors. What **blessing** these dear friends





have been to us! God used another family to provide for our washer and dryer. How exciting to see all of the pieces falling into place!

Since having been exposed to black mold for so long, we felt the urgency to encapsulate the crawlspace and install a dehumidifier (this will make sure the moisture

level is kept at or below 40% to prevent the growth of mold).



Susan's sisters helped with the final clean-up of walls, floors, and furniture just before Christmas. Christmas Eve was our first night to sleep in our new home. We still have a lot to move, and a lot to finish

building, but we are finally moved out of the 5th Wheel. **Praise the Lord!**

Please continue to pray for Susan - her health has steadily declined. Every part of her body hurts, and the fatigue is overwhelming. Fresh Apple Cake

Ingredients:

- 3 Eggs
- 2 C. Sugar
- 1 C. Oil (or melted Butter)
- 2 C. Flour (self-rising)
- 1 tsp. Cinnamon
- 1 tsp. Vanilla
- 3 C. Apples (peeled and diced) 1 C. Pecans
- 1 C. Fresh Blueberries (dried and tossed in flour)
- 1 C. Raisins (optional)

Cream Eggs, Sugar, and Oil together. In a separate bowl, add Flour and Cinnamon and stir with fork until thoroughly combined; add to Sugar mixture and mix by hand until well blended. Add Vanilla and mix well. Fold in remaining ingredients. Pour into greased and floured 9" x 13" cake pan. Bake at 350° F for 1 hour.

For a moist cake, use a quad-loaf pan (4 mini loaves in one) and bake for about 35 minutes.

*The below glaze is not necessary, because the fruit naturally sweetens the cake.

<u>Glaze</u>

- 2 C. Powdered Sugar
- 1 tsp. Vanilla

Mix Powdered Sugar, Vanilla, and enough Milk to make a glaze. Drizzle over cake directly after removing from oven. Enjoy hot or cold! Top with Vanilla Ice Cream.
